THE BASICS



Applicable Law - Subcontracts

- State Law (federal law and FAR may preempt)
- UCC
- Common Law (state court decisions)
- Federal Courts (diversity, federal question)
- Choice of law

Government Right to Terminate

- Inherent Authority
 Concept existed since after Civil War
 - Based on principle that government should not have to buy when need no longer exists
 Government needs this flexibility
 - ☑ Government needs this flexibility
- Contractual Authority
 - Inherent authority regularized in contract language
 - Permits orderly discontinuance of contract
 - ☑ Limits contractor recovery



Authority

- Under convenience termination clause, government may terminate without cause
 - Standard: whether termination for convenience is in the government's best interest
 - Consideration: government agrees to pay reasonable, allocable costs plus profits on those costs (subject to important limitations)

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The Mechanics of the Termination

- Written Notice
- Effective Date
- Work Stoppage
- Audit and Disposition of Inventory
- Settlement Proposal
 - ☑ Timing
 - ☑ Basis (Inventory/Total Cost/No Cost)
- Accounting Audit
- Consequences of No or Late Proposal

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What Does the Subcontractor Receive?

- Costs incurred to point of termination
 ✓ Fairness principle on costs
- Profit on those incurred costs
- Limitations
 - **☑** Cost Principles
 - **☑** Total Contract Price
 - ☑ Funding Limitations

☑ Anticipatory Profits/Consequential Damages

• Special Termination Costs

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What Costs are Allowed?

- Basic test for cost recovery
 - ☑ Reasonableness
 - ☑ Allowability
 - ☑ Allocability
- Separate Account
- Recoverable Costs
 - ☑ Caps on Overhead
 - Distinguish between continuing productive and continuing non-productive costs
 - Continuing productive costs generally recoverably
- Limited to Obligated Funds, BUT

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Pre-Termination Costs

- Remedies under the Termination For Convenience clause for Pre-Termination Expenses
 - ☑ Completed inventory
 - ☑ Reasonable cost incurred
 - > Allowability
 - ☑ Initial Costs
 - ☑ Termination Inventory



Post-Termination Costs

- Remedies under the Termination For Convenience clause for Post-Termination Expenses
 - ☑ Those which the supplier cannot discontinue immediately despite reasonable efforts
 - Costs the supplier incurs on account of the termination

Post-Termination Costs

- Costs continuing after termination
 Mitigation of Costs
 - > Reasonable efforts to discontinue
 - ☑ Continuing Salaries
 - Standby Status
 - > Relocating employees
 - **☑** Severance Pay
 - **Work in Progress / Costs of Completion**
 - Settlements with lower tier subcontractors
 Facilities and Equipment
- Overhead Costs
 - ☑ Normal Overhead and G & A
 - ☑ Unabsorbed Overhead

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Settlement Costs

- Settlement Expenses
 Claim Preparation / Prosecution
 - ☑ Preparation of Termination Settlement
 - > Presentation/Negotiation/Continuation
 - ☑ Allocability
 - ☑ Separate Accounting
 - Reasonableness
 - Outside consultants
 - Inside expenses
 - **☑** Inventory Disposition

☑ Indirect Costs Relating to Settlement

Settlement Costs

• Limitations

☑ Overall contract price (ceiling)

- Plus valid claims
- > Plus settlement expenses
- **No Anticipatory Profits**
- ☑ No full recovery for "useable items"
- Costs must be reasonable, allowable, allocable and kept IAW GAAP.

Approval)**
 - Submit a Termination Settlement Proposal (TSP)
 Dispose of Termination Inventory

- Additional Termination Activities
 - ☑ Cost Accumulation
 - ☑ Budgeting / Forecasting
 - ☑ Inventory Identification and Classification
 - ☑ Data Management
 - Reduction in Force
 - ☑ Training / Reassignment
 - Any Other Tasks Requested by GDLS, LSI or US Govt.
